### Rose Hawthorne

Founder of the Servants of Relief for Incurable Cancer (1851 - 1926)

Rose Hawthorne was the third and favorite child of Nathaniel Hawthorne, the great American writer. Her father died when she was thirteen, a loss followed a few years later by the death of her mother. Bereft, Rose accepted the marriage proposal of George Lathrop, a young American writer, whom she married in 1871 soon after her twentieth birthday. The marriage deteriorated, largely due to Lathrop's alcoholism. For a time a common attraction to Catholicism held promise of restoring the marriage. In 1891 they were both received into the Catholic Church, but two years later they formally separated.

Finding herself alone in New York City, Rose felt called to some more heroic expression of her faith. She became aware of the plight of impoverished victims of cancer who were banished to die in isolation on Blackwell's Island. She was determined to provide an alternative.

After obtaining a nursing degree, she began visiting and then inviting cancer patients into her own apartment. This became a full-time occupation. After the death of Lathrop she formalized her vocation by entering religious life. In 1900 she and a companion were received into the Dominican order. Six years later her own Dominican congregation was formally established, and she became known as Mother Alphonsa. She died at seventy-five on July 9, 1926, at the motherhouse of her congregation in Hawthorne, New York.

#### **Nothing to Lose**

Most of us hold on tightly to nearly everything, from our car keys to our children and our professional reputations to our lives. Even when we think we've let go of material possessions, we still hold on to less tangible things. And we don't realize how much this closes us off from others.

Once again, Pope Francis sets a remarkable example of someone who lives without fear because he knows that his life is in God's hands. In an interview with a Spanish newspaper, he talked about not using the bulletproof pope mobile. Calling it a "sardine can", he didn't like the way it separated him from his people. "It's true that anything could happen, but let's face it, at my age I don't have much to lose", he said.

The joy he obviously gains form mingling with people wherever he goes seems more important to him than the risk involved. His response to a question about how he would like to be remembered showed the humility that we've come to expect from this man: "I have not thought about this," Pope Francis said, "but I like it when you recall someone and say 'he was a good guy, he did what he could, and he was not that bad.' With that I would be content."

We could do worse than to adopt this attitude!
