Blessed Among Us Bartolome de Las Casas "Defender of the Indians" (1484-1566)

Bartolome de Las Casas was the most distinguished of a number of Dominican friars who raised their voices against the rapacious violence inflicted on the Indians of the Americas. Serving originally as a chaplain in the Spanish conquest of Cuba (while also benefiting as the owner of a plantation), in 1514 he underwent a dramatic conversion. After witnessing the genocidal cruelty inflicted on the Indians, he joined the Dominican order and became a passionate and prophetic defender of the indigenous peoples. For more than fifty years he traveled back and forth between the New World and the court of Spain, attempting to expose the cruelties of the Conquest, whose very legitimacy, and not merely excesses, he disavowed.

Las Casas opposed the notion that the Gospel could be spread through slaughter or compulsion of any kind. While others claimed the Indians were a lesser race, he affirmed their full humanity and entitlement to human rights. But he went further. Identifying the Indians with the poor in the Gospel sense, he argued that in their sufferings they represented the crucified Christ.

In 1544 he was named bishop of Chiapas in southern Mexico, but he eventually resigned his bishopric and returned to Spain, the better, he hoped, to promote the cause of social justice. He died on July 18, 1566, at the age of eighty-two.

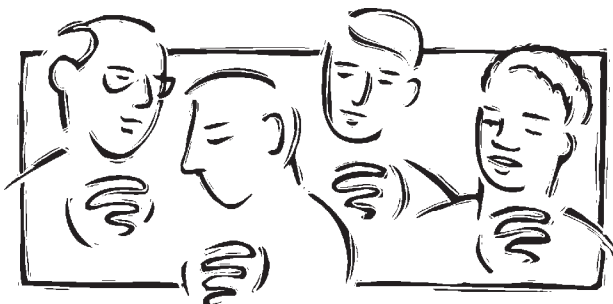

The U.S. Supreme Court ruled in favor of the right of Hobby Lobby Stores and Conestoga Wood Specialties to apply their religious principles in the conduct of their business and to uphold an important fundamental right on which this country was founded: The right to religious freedom.
 While the June 30th, 2014 decision applied only to the rights of closely-held corporations and their right to religious liberty in the context of contraceptives and related services, the Catholic Diocese of Fort Worth is hopeful that future court decisions will enable Catholic organizations such as schools and charities to prevail in their objection to a "so-called accommodation."...
