Blessed Among Us Otto Neururer and Jakob Gapp Martyrs (d. 1940, 1943)

These two Austrian priests, both martyrs under the Nazis, were beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1996.

Otto Neururer (1882-1940) was the first Austrian priest arrested by the Nazis after the incorporation of Austria into Greater Germany in 1938. The immediate cause seems to have been his counsel to a young woman that she not marry a Nazi storm trooper, by whom she was pregnant. After his arrest in 1939, he was sent to Dachau and then Buchenwald, where he was consigned to a torture block and suspended by his feet until he died on May 30, 1940.

Jakob Gapp (1897-1943) was a Marianist priest who made no attempt to disguise his contempt for the Nazis. He protested when pictures of Hitler were placed in the school where he taught, and he instructed his students of their duty to love all people, "French people, Jews, and Communists alike." "God, not Adolf Hitler, is your God," he proclaimed. With the encouragement of his order, he fled Germany for France, and then Spain, where he worked as a chaplain. In 1942, Gestapo agents posing as catechumens spirited him across the border to France, where he was arrested and transported to Germany, to be charged with treason. During his interrogation, he boldly defended his faith—so effectively that Heinrich Himmler, who read the transcripts, supposedly regretted that there were not more Germans equally committed to National Socialism. He was beheaded on August 13, 1943.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary August 15th

The feast of the Assumption celebrates our belief that Mary "was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory". This unprecedented act by God anticipates "the resurrection of all members of Christ's body". In our readings today, we encounter Mary as an expectant mother visiting Elizabeth and sharing with her the joy of motherhood. Tradition locates the house of Zechariah and Elizabeth several miles outside of Jerusalem. This means that Mary's journey from Nazareth in Galilee to Judea would have taken about three days. There is a heightened sense of joy in Luke's description of the meeting of the mothers. Even John the Baptist "leaped for joy" in his mother's womb in response to Mary's greeting and the presence of the Messiah.



In Corinthians, Paul speaks of Christ as the "first fruits of those who have fallen asleep". Christ's resurrection is not intended to be unique; it is a foreshadowing of our own resurrection at the end of time. The Bible tells us that death is a result of sin. But "just as in Adam all die, / so too in Christ shall all be brought to life". Mary's assumption, an anticipation of our own resurrection, is on account of her life lived without sin. Not having sinned, she does not face the consequence of sin and so shares in the resurrected life immediately.

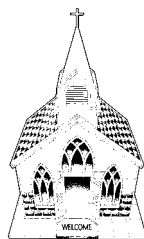

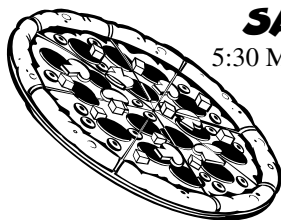
