## Blessed Among Us

*Blessed Mother Teresa*

**Founder of the Missionaries of Charity (1910-1997)**

In her later years Mother Teresa was widely recognized as a living emblem of God's love. She received countless honors, including the Nobel Peace Prize. Yet for years she toiled in obscurity. In fact, the Albanian-born nun had spent twenty years as a Loreto Sister in her order's schools in India before receiving the "call within a call" that defined her distinctive vocation. One day in 1946, while traveling by train to Darjeeling in the Himalayas, she had suddenly sensed that God "wanted me to be poor with the poor, and love him in the distressing disguise of the poorest of the poor."

With her congregation's permission she left the convent, donned a simple white sari, and went out to seek Jesus in the desperate byways of Calcutta. Eventually others joined her and they became the Missionaries of Charity. And she became Mother Teresa.

Though in time she established centers of service around the globe, she remained particularly identified with her original home for the dying in Calcutta. There, destitute and dying men and women, gathered off the streets, received loving care until they died. Those who had lived like "animals in the gutter" were enabled to "die like angels"-knowing they were valued and loved as children of God.

She died on September 5, 1997, and was beatified in 2003 by Pope John Paul II.

### The 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time August 31, 2014

In today's first reading, Jeremiah learns that our ways are not God's ways and that sometimes the work of a prophet meets resistance and involves suffering. But still he perseveres because of his faith in God. In the second reading, Paul encourages perseverance, for we know that God will reward our faithfulness. But as God glorified Christ, so too will we be given a share in that glory. In today's Gospel, Peter rejects the idea that Jesus must suffer and die. And now Jesus, who in the last episode had just given the disciple the name Peter (Rock), addresses him as "Satan" because he is not thinking "as God does, but as human beings do". For in order to follow Christ, we must carry our own crosses.

*For reflection: Has my faith brought suffering? How did I respond to it? How does Christ's suffering add to my understanding of God?*

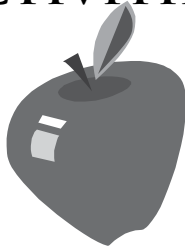
