Blessed Among Us

*Blessed Jerzy Popieluszko
Priest & Martyr (1947-1984)*

The end of the communist era in Eastern Europe began in June 1979 when John Paul II, the newly elected pope from Poland, returned to his homeland for the first of three visits. As communist authorities stood by helplessly, millions turned out to hear the pontiff's message: "Do not be afraid to insist on your rights. Refuse a life based on lies and double thinking. Do not be afraid to suffer with Christ." Within a year of his visit the militant Solidarity trade union movement was born.

Fr. Jerzy Popieluszko had not previously taken an active part in politics. But when steelworkers in Warsaw chose to support the striking ship workers in Gdansk he volunteered to celebrate Mass at their factory. It was a turning point in his life. The workers' struggle for justice, he realized, was truly a spiritual struggle. He became their chaplain.

Fr. Jerzy accompanied the Solidarity struggle through martial law and persecution. Though he himself was repeatedly interrogated and threatened with arrest, he refused to seek asylum abroad. "The priest is called to bear witness to the truth," he said, "to suffer for the truth, and if need be to give up his life for it."

On Oct. 19 he was abducted by security police, beaten, and drowned in a reservoir. Three years later, in the first free elections in Poland, a Solidarity government was elected. Fr. Jerzy was beatified in 2010.

"It is not enough for a Christian to condemn evil, cowardice, lies, and use of force, hatred, and oppression. He must at all times be a witness to and defender of justice, goodness, truth, freedom, and love. He must never tire of claiming these values as aright both for himself and others."—Blessed Jerzy Popieluszko

After King Cyrus of Persia defeated Babylon, he allowed the Jewish exiles to return home. Isaiah interprets all of this as part of God's plan. For him, this is an indication that the God of Israel is the God of all the earth: "there is no other". The census tax and the coin required to pay it were both very offensive to the Jews in Jesus's day. The fact that Jesus's questioners can produce "the Roman coin" is evidence of their hypocrisy. Jesus does not let them trick him, because they are two separate things, and our obligation to God is more important than obligations to others.

For Reflection: Do I thank God for the example of faith in the lives of those around me? How can I more fully give "to God what belongs to God"?

World Mission Sunday

In the early 19th century in France, a young laywoman, Pauline Jaricot, became inspired by news from the missions of her day - our own country included. She began gathering together small groups - mostly workers in her family's silk factory. She asked each member of the group to offer daily prayer and a weekly sacrifice of a sou (the equivalent of a penny at that time), insisting that her efforts be for all the Church's missions. From Pauline's vision came the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. The first collection in 1822 supported the vast diocese of Louisiana, and the missions of Kentucky and China.
