Blessed Among Us

*Blessed Restituta Kafak
Martyr (1894-1943)*

Restituta Kafka, who took her religious name from a third century martyr beheaded under the Roman Emperor Aurelian, was raised in Vienna. At the age of nineteen she entered a nursing order, the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity, and served faithfully for many years in the district hospital in Modling, near Vienna. Eventually she was put in charge of the operating room.

After the German annexation of Austria in 1938, the Nazis forbade any religious symbols in the hospitals or schools. Sister Restituta, refusing to comply with this order, conspicuously installed crucifixes in every room in a new ward of the hospital. After being denounced to the Gestapo by one of the hospital surgeons, a fanatical Nazi, she was arrested on Ash Wednesday in 1942. Following a year in prison, she was sentenced to death for "aiding and abetting the enemy in the betrayal of the fatherland and for plotting high treason." Hitler's secretary, Martin Bormann, wished to make a special example of her and personally signed her execution decree. Restituta was beheaded on March 30, 1943, and her body was thrown into a mass grave. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1998.

30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

October 26, 2014

The first reading covers the Israelites' duties toward strangers, widows and orphans and the poor in general. They are a practical application of the law of charity in their dealings with their neighbors. In



the second reading, St. Paul continues to praise the Thessalonians, not only for accepting the faith in difficult circumstances, but for the wonderful example their Christian life had already given to most of Greece. In the Gospel for today the Pharisees may not have had evil intentions when asking Christ the question as to the greatest commandment. But they have done us a good service by getting this crystal clear answer from him. In this answer he tells us that the man who loves God and neighbor fulfills all his obligations, and carries out all the duties that God's self-revelation in "the law and the prophets" imposes on him.
