Blessed Among Us

**Blessed Michael Kozal
Bishop and Martyr (1893-1943)**

Michael Kozal was born in a small village in Poland. After entering the seminary he was ordained a priest in 1918. In the following years he filled a number of assignments, concluding with his appointment as rector of the major seminary of Gniezno. In 1939 he was named auxiliary bishop of Wloclawek, where he was consecrated in the cathedral on August 13.

His episcopal service was short-lived. Two weeks later, on September 1, the Nazis invaded Poland and immediately launched a campaign against the Church and other symbols of national identity. German troops arrived in Wloclawek on September 14, suppressing religious publications, seizing church buildings, and arresting hundreds of clergy. Bishop Kozal issued protests to no avail. Refusing the opportunity to flee, he insisted on remaining with his people.

On November 7 he was arrested along with other priests and imprisoned in the city jail. After confinement in a convent for over a year, he was transported in 1941 to Dachau, where thousands of clergy were held captive. During his imprisonment he continued to exercise his priestly mission, offering spiritual guidance to his fellow priests and, when possible, celebrating Mass. He said, "I give you the greatest gift, Jesus in the Eucharist. God is with us. God will never abandon us. On January 30, 1943, after being executed by a fatal injection, his body was incinerated in the camp crematorium.

He was beatified by Pope John Paul II during one of his first pilgrimages to his native Poland.

Blessing of the Throats

Catholics remember Saint Blaise's feast day because of the Blessing of the Throats that took place on this day. Two candles are blessed, held slightly open, and pressed against the throat as the blessing is said. Saint Blaise's protection of those with throat troubles apparently comes from a legend that a boy was brought to him who had a fishbone stuck in his throat. The boy was about to die when Saint Blaise healed him.
