Blessed Among Us St. Ursula Ledochowska Founder (1865-1939)

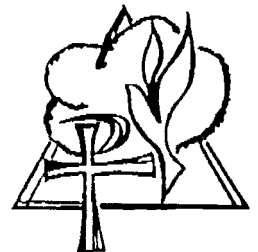
Julia Ledochowska was born into a remarkable Polish family. Her younger brother became provincial superior of the Jesuits in Poland, while a younger sister, founder of the Sodality of St. Peter Claver, was beatified in 1975. In 1886 Julia entered the Ursuline order and assumed the religious name of the order's patron saint. She spent the next twenty-one years in the convent in Krakow. In 1907 she was among several sisters sent to St. Petersburg to run a boarding school for girls. From there, after the outbreak of World War I, she moved to Stockholm and Denmark, where she established a school for girls and helped with war refugees.

With the establishment of an independent Polish republic she and her sisters returned to Poland. There, with support from Rome, she established a separate Ursuline congregation known as the Grey Ursulines, who combined education with work among the poor. By the time of her death on May 29, 1939, she had become an important figure in the religious and cultural life of her country. In his homily at her canonization in 2003, Pope John Paul II hailed her as "an apostle of the new evangelization, demonstrating a constant timeliness, creativity, and the effectiveness of gospel love by her life and action...From her we can learn how to put into practice every day the 'new' commandment of love."

The Most Holy Trinity

Trinity Sunday, a moveable feast, is celebrated a week after Pentecost Sunday in honor of the most fundamental of Christian beliefs. We can never fully understand the mystery of the Trinity, but we can sum it up in the following formula: God is three Persons in one Nature. The three Persons of God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—are all equally God, and they cannot be divided.



To stress the doctrine of the Trinity, Fathers of the Church, such as St. Ephrem the Syrian, composed prayers and hymns that were recited in the Church's liturgies and on Sundays as part of the Divine Office, the official prayer of the Church. Eventually, a special version of this office began to be celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost, and the Church in England, at the request of St. Thomas à Becket (1118-1170), was granted permission to celebrate Trinity Sunday. The celebration of Trinity Sunday was made universal by Pope John XXII (1316-34).

Dear Padre

Why doesn't Jesus know everything God knows?

How can Jesus not know everything God knows?

Mark 13:32 says of the end of the world, "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." If Jesus, God the Father, and the Holy Spirit are one, how can Jesus not know everything God knows?

In our studies about Jesus, Christology, we believe Jesus is 100 percent human and 100 percent divine. Two natures in one person. That is a mystery.

So when Jesus says he does not know the day of the end of the world, he means that his human nature does not know.

That same doctrine is the way we understand how Jesus as divine could die—that is, his human part. That is how the Lord entered into our history and can really save us: He is truly one of us.

Every person has free will. That means our choices are not predetermined. God knows all our possible choices and how those choices will affect the world. So there are multiple possible futures. God knows them all, so God does know when the world will end.

The human mind cannot conceive every possible choice and every possible effect. So just as Jesus had to learn to speak, in his humanity he cannot know all possible futures.
