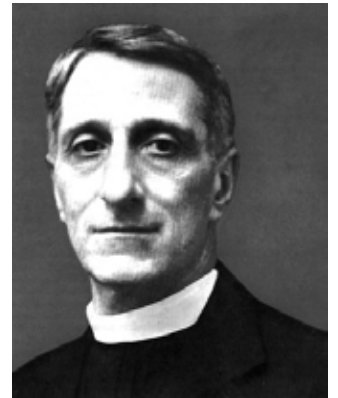

Blessed Among Us Luigi Sturzo Priest and Politician (1871-1959)

Throughout modern history, the Church has at times taken different positions on the participation of clergy in political parties and elected office. As a priest, there is no doubt that Luigi Sturzo was also a critical player in the Italian political landscape. His trouble with the Vatican centered more on the leaning of his politics and his efforts to enlist the Church firmly in the cause of anti-fascism.

Ordained in 1894, Sturzo taught theology before serving for fifteen years as vice-mayor of Caltagirone in Sicily. In 1919 he was one of the founders of the Italian People's Party (PPI). The party wished to enter into a coalition with the Socialist Party to block the rise of the fascists. The Vatican would not permit this, instead encouraging the rise of a pro-fascist Catholic party. With the rise of Mussolini, Sturzo resigned from the PPI and went into exile, first in England and later in the United States, where he continued to engage in anti-fascist writing, returning to Italy only in 1946. In 1952 he was named a Senator for Life. He died at eighty-seven in 1959.

"He met each duty as it came, fearless, outspoken, understanding, trying to give guidance in the world of men. He was not one who thought in terms of how many souls there were in his parish. He thought of them as body, mind, and soul, and realized their needs, the kind of society suited to man and his freedom. To read of such men arouses courage in others."—Dorothy Day

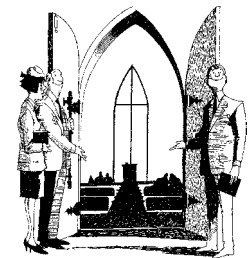


TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD AUGUST 6TH

The feast of the Transfiguration of Christ celebrates the revelation of Christ's divine glory on Mount Tabor in Galilee (Matthew 17:1-6; Mark 9:1-8; Luke 9:28-36). After revealing to His disciples that He would be put to death in Jerusalem, Christ, along with Peter, James and John went up the mountain. There Jesus was transfigured before them and his face did shine as the sun: and his garments became white as snow.

This feast holds great significance for Christians. It is a theophany—a revelation of the glory of God and a testimony that Jesus Christ is truly both God and man. Transfiguration, however, is not a Holy Day of Obligation.

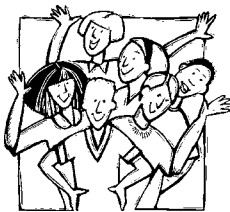
