## Blessed Among Us Saints Michael, Gabriel, Raphael Archangels

Of the many angels—messengers of God—who appear throughout the Scriptures, only three are named. These archangels, so-called because they deliver messages of supreme importance, are celebrated today. Unlike human saints, the very existence of these incorporeal beings is a matter of faith. And yet their deeds are assigned a special place in the history of salvation.



Michael, a warrior, appears in the Book of Revelation, where he leads the armies of God in battle against the forces of evil. The angel Gabriel appears to Zechariah to prophesy the birth of his son John the Baptist, and later he is “sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin’s name was Mary.” His greeting to Mary resonates to this day: “Hail, O favored one, the Lord is with you.” The angel Raphael appears in the Book of Tobit, where he serves as a guide to the young Tobias.

We may not aspire to emulate these holy beings in the same way we do other saints. But we may invoke their aid and invite their assistance in resisting evil, in bearing witness to the good news, in navigating our way through the challenges that beset us, and in finding our way to those we are intended to meet.

“For with God nothing shall be impossible.” —St. Gabriel (Luke 1:37)

**Why do Scripture readings jump around?**

Why are the Scripture readings for Mass so piecemeal? We read part of a verse then jump to another part. Doesn't reading the Bible like this distort the meaning of the passage?

The readings for Mass are in a book called the Lectionary. Our current Lectionary was set up after the Second Vatican Council. It uses a three-year cycle for the Sunday readings, so over three years we hear the majority of the Bible at Mass. Its introduction states, "The present Order of Readings for Mass, then, is an arrangement of biblical readings that provides the faithful with a knowledge of the whole of God's word, in a pattern suited to the purpose" (General Introduction to the Lectionary, Second Edition #60). So the readings are not piecemeal but rather arranged so we are exposed to the whole of God's word within three years. At times a given reading may not be complete—for example, the first reading for the third Sunday of Advent, Year B, is Zephaniah 3:14-18a. This is done not so much for brevity but for clarity. Those who organized the Lectionary thought that this excerpt made the message clearer or gave better emphasis to a point in the reading. It certainly is good to get out your Bible and to read the whole section so you can see what is missing, but when the word is proclaimed at Mass, the current arrangement is most effective.
