### Blessed Among Us Mollie Rogers Founder of the Maryknoll Sisters (1882-1955)

Mollie Rogers dated the beginning of her vocation to a summer evening at Smith College when a crowd of her fellow students rushed outdoors singing "Onward Christian Soldiers". They had just signed the Student Volunteer pledge to go to China as Protestant missionaries. Mollie shared their exhilaration, mixed with regret that there was no similar Catholic mission group.

Her prayers were answered several years later when she met Fr. James A. Walsh, who, along with Fr. Thomas Price, planned to establish a mission seminary—Maryknoll. Mollie volunteered to help launch this project. Eventually, she and a small group of women who joined her won approval to found a new religious congregation—the Maryknoll Sisters—with Mollie, now Mother Mary Joseph, as superior. Their aim was not simply to serve as helpers to the priests but to engage in their own overseas work of evangelization and service. It was a radical departure from traditional, enclosed religious life. Mother Mary Joseph stressed the importance of flexibility and individuality. She didn't want the Sisters' work "to be hampered by an over-regimented and parceled-out prayer life".

From mission work among Japanese immigrants in California, to China, Korea, and eventually throughout the world, the work of the Maryknoll Sisters spread. At the time of Rogers' death on October 9, 1955, there were 1,100 Maryknoll Sisters serving worldwide. They marked their centenary in 2012.
