Blessed Among Us Joao Bosco Bournier Jesuit Martyr of Brazil (1917-1976)

Joao Bosco Bournier entered the Jesuits with dreams of serving in the overseas mission. Instead he was assigned for nearly thirty years to administrative duties that brought little sense of fulfillment. He prayed for some deliverance. At last in 1966 he was assigned to be a missionary—not overseas, but in the frontier region of Mato Grosso, a newly created region carved out of the Amazon jungle. For wealthy cattle barons there were fortunes to be made. But for landless peasants who provided the labor, existence was little removed from bondage.



In this context Bournier had to rethink everything he had learned about theology. He concluded that his task was not just to administer the sacraments but to advance the cause of human dignity and justice. He was fortunate to find in his bishop, Pedro Casaldaliga, one of the true prophets of Latin America. Together they visited the most remote villages in the diocese. On October 11, 1976, they set off to a local jail to intercede for two peasant women who were incarcerated.

Outside the jail they confronted the police, who responded contemptuously, calling them “commies”. When one of them struck Bournier with his gun, it discharged, shooting the priest in the head. “I’ve finished my course,” he whispered. “Dom Pedro, we’ve come to the end of the job together.”

“In this place was assassinated Father Joao Bosco Bournier, for defending the liberty of the poor. He died, like Jesus Christ, offering his life for our liberation.”
