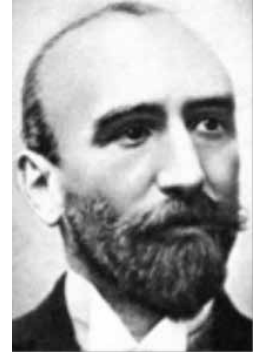

## Blessed Among Us Blessed Contardo Ferrini Scholar and Layman (1859-1902)

Among the great majority of official saints drawn from traditional "religious life," Contardo Ferrini stands out as a layman who expressed his holiness in the world of scholarship and public service. From early youth he had felt a deep dedication to prayer. But rather than enter the priesthood he chose to pursue a religious vocation in the world. Through studies in Pavia in Italy and later in Berlin he became one of the world's authorities on Roman law. He taught at a number of universities and published hundreds of scholarly articles and several textbooks. In 1895 he was elected to the municipal council of Milan. Apart from this work he had a passion for nature and mountaineering.



Although he was a Franciscan tertiary, he was not the type of saint famous for prodigious acts of charity or mystical visions. What seems to have impressed those who came in contact with him was an overwhelming goodness and thirst for life—the evidence that it is possible to lead a holy life in the midst of the ordinary duties of work and life in the world. In pronouncing his beatification in 1947, Pope Pius XII referred to him as a man who "gave an emphatic 'Yes' to the possibility of holiness in these days."

Ferrini died of typhus on Oct. 17, 1902, at the age of forty-three. His feast is Oct. 26.

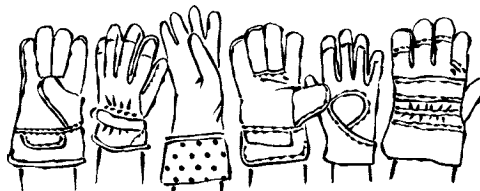
