March 19—The Feast of St. Joseph

It is easy to overlook Joseph, much as we overlook those millions of men and women who do their work quietly and well, without the least fanfare, and who for the most part never make the papers. And it is just this sense of anonymity, of invisibility, that attracts me to him: that he was a good provider, that he was chosen to care for God's only son, to watch over him, teach him, shape him, and to protect and love the boy's mother.



I think of him teaching his young son how to follow the grain of a piece of olive wood, how to plane it, learning patience, trying to earn a fair day's wages for a fair day's work to put that daily bread on the table. Or

perhaps patiently standing in a queue, looing for work. I think of Joseph—to paraphrase the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins—living in ten thousand places: in the man rising at 2:00 am to plow the deserted snow-clogged roads, the nurse working the night shift and then a day shift, the cop on the lonely beat, the mother with the autistic daughter or paralyzed son, the office worker biting his lip at some slight or racial insensitivity against him, because he too has bread to put on his family's table. I think of him as someone with photos of his wife and kid hanging on the wall behind his cubicle, telling me that— as much as he'd like to sell me another car—I can still get another couple of years out of the one I've got. The thousand daily human gestures of a man going about his rounds each day. But a dreamer too, dreaming dreams in which he hears voices, as once he believed he'd heard a voice that loved and trusted him enough to place a son—and the son's mother—in his faltering capable, and very human hands.

US WWII veteran to reunite with wartime girlfriend in Adelaide, Australia

Norwood Thomas, 93, will fly from his Virginia Beach home to wrap

his arms around the young girl who broke his heart all those years ago, when she declined his marriage proposal. That young girl is Joyce Morris, 88, who admits to still thinking of her handsome soldier every day. Last year, Mrs. Morris asked her son, Rob if he could help her find her lost love. "She asked me if it was really possible to find people on the internet," Mr. Morris said yesterday. "I said: 'You've got to be kidding; this guy's probably dead long ago.'" However, he discovered Mr. Thomas had made the news by skydiving at 88, so he contacted *The Virginian-Pilot* newspaper for help finding him. Joyce was 16 and Tommy 21. But after their story went public two months ago, more than 300 people made donations online to help the two rekindle their romance. Air New Zealand has offered to fly Mr. Thomas and his son to Australia to reunite Joyce and Tommy for Valentine's Day 2016.

Pastor's Remarks:

Those who say: "Out of sight out of mind", do not understand the power of love. Walls and oceans can separate people but can never suppress or extinguish the fire of love.

The prodigal son was for some time out of his father's sight, but the father never stopped loving him. We may leave Jesus for some time, but Jesus never loses sight of us and when He eventually finds us, like the father in the parable and like Tommy and Joyce, we rekindle our romance. "Joyce Morris, 88, who admits to still thinking of her handsome soldier every day", Jesus too thinks of us everyday. "Mrs. Morris asked her son, Rob if he could help her find her lost love". Prayers, reconciliation, perseverance and hope help us find Jesus. "I said: 'you've got to be kidding; this guy' s probably dead long ago"". Love never dies and with God all things are possible. After 70 years, Thomas in the U.S., Joyce in Australia, were reunited and had their dreams of love come true. St. Paul gives us some qualities of love: "Love is patient...love bears all things, hopes all thing, endures all things. Love never fails". 1 Cor. 13:8. Tommy is holding (above) a picture of Joyce 16, when he was 21, which he got about 70 years ago. Do you want to see someone who still loves you? Look at the crucifix. When He was on the cross, you were in His mind. During this Lenten season, find time to thank Him for His love; ask Him to help you renew your love for Him.
