## **Blessed Among Us** John J. Considine Maryknoll Priest (1897-1982)

Though he never held an overseas mission assignment, Maryknoll Father John J. Considine was one for the leading figures in Catholic mission in the twentieth century. A tireless researcher, promoter, and networker, the author of many books and countless articles, he labored persistently to promote the idea of mission as an essential expression of the life of the Church.

Born in New Bedford, Massachusetts, Considine was one of the earliest recruits to Maryknoll. Ordained in 1923, he was sent the next year to Rome to work in the Vatican Office for the Propagation of the Faith. While there he founded the Fides News Service, offering a unique on-the-ground source for global news. Returning to Maryknoll after ten years, he was instrumental in extending the Society's mission to Africa and Latin America.

Traditionally Catholic Latin America had seldom been regarded as a mission field. But Considine saw a need. As the first director of the U.S. Bishop's Latin America Office in the 1960s, he helped mobilize clergy, religious, and lay missioners for service in Latin America. Ahead of his time in his post-colonial vision of mission, Considine spoke of "world Christianity" and emphasized the importance of inculturation, interreligious dialogue, and the promotion of social justice. He lived to see these themes taken up by the post - Vatican II Church. He died on May 4, 1982.

"It is not enough for the Church to send out missioners... The teachings of Christianity applied to the world require still more than service to all men; they require brotherhood with all men."—Fr. John J. Considine

# **Dear Padre**

#### Is it a sin to be mad at God?

My husband and I are divorcing. We have four children. Yesterday my eight-yearold said she's "mad at God for letting this happen." I told her it's a sin to be mad at God, but she says she doesn't care. What should I do?

**First of all,** your eight-year-old's world is being shaken to its core by your divorce. She's frightened, confused, and worried about what will happen. She's expressing her feelings and frustrations.

Don't tell her it's a sin to have angry thoughts and feelings about God. We're emotional human beings with strong passions and moods, and the Lord understands when we're distressed and troubled. Even Jesus had moments of anger—for example, when he drove the moneychangers out of the temple (Matthew 21:12).

Tell her God loves us and gives us freedom to choose. God isn't responsible for your divorce. Reassure your daughter that you love her no matter what, even when she's mad at God. Life after the divorce will be different, but not necessarily unhappy.

This is also an opportunity for her to learn that life isn't always the way we wish it would be.

God doesn't make bad things happen. Human beings aren't perfect, and God helps us survive and grow through difficult moments.
