Blessed Among Us Sargent Shriver Public Servant (1915-2011)

Nov. 9th marks the centenary of the birth of Sargent Shriver, a statesman whose public service was deeply rooted in his Catholic faith and the question he asked himself each day: "What have I done to improve the lot of humanity?"

His marriage in 1953 to Eunice Kennedy-sister of the future president-drew him into public life. Under President Kennedy he served as the founding director of the Peace Corps-still, after fifty years, a signal expression of idealistic service. Under President Johnson, as the first director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, he oversaw the War on Poverty, founding such organizations as Head Start, Vista, and Job Corps. Millions of people directly benefited from his work.

A devout Catholic, Shriver attended daily Mass and was never without a rosary in his pocket. A devoted father of five, he supported his wife Eunice in founding the Special Olympics-for which he later served as president. As his biographer noted, he derived from his faith, "less the solace of the Lord's presence, "than "a kind of mobilizing vision for action here on earth."

He died, following a long descent into Alzheimer's disease on January 18, 2011.

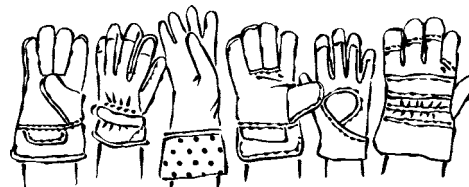
